(c) The debate competition on contemporary issues for college students was organized on 18/08/2017. It was participated by 11 teams of students.



REPORT ON THE FEED BACK FORM - 2017-2018

In order to get feedback response from the students about the various academic, co-curricular and other activities in the College, a well-structured feedback form was obtained from the students of college. In the current academic year i.e., 2017-18, the feedback forms were filled in by the students before the examination. The analysis of the feedback forms is as under:

There were total thirteen questions asked in the feedback form. Out of 13 questions, the first 3 questions were related to the nature of syllabus, its adequacy or otherwise and how much syllabus was covered in the class. Eight questions (from question 4 to 11) dealt with the ability of teachers to teach, his preparation in the class-room, role and approach of teacher in encouraging the students to learn, teaching-learning methods etc. The 12<sup>th</sup> question was about the overall assistance received from the non-teaching or administrative staff of the College. The last 13<sup>th</sup> question was for the general comments of the students about the infrastructure provided by the college in terms of library, sports, canteen, and computer library etc.

About 54% students found the syllabus adequate for each course. For 10 per cent of students it was manageable and for 12 per cent it was easy to understand. About 36 per cent students found it challenging and 4 per cent found it slightly difficult. According to 82 per cent students, the concerned teachers covered the syllabus to the extent of 85 to 100 per cent and the material provided by them was adequate to understand the subject. For 52 per cent students, material for prescribed reading viz. books, reference books etc. was available easily whereas 44 per cent students get the said material with some difficulty.

As regards the preparation of the teachers, around 70 per cent students stated that teachers were preparing thoroughly and were able to communicate very effectively. The most of the teachers involved the students in group discussion and encouraged them to put forward their queries and difficulties etc. The advice provided by the teachers was found to be very helpful by around 62 per cent students. For 72 per cent students, overall teachers' approach was always courteous.

According to 46 per cent students, they get regular assistance from the non-teaching and administrative staff of the College, whereas for 42 per cent students it was occasional.

As regards the last questions (General comments on infrastructure and other facilities provided by the college) most of the students were happy. However, few students were not happy and made critical comments. The summary of such comments is as under: -



1. A handful number of students complained about the lack of discipline in the library. According to them, there is too much noise in the library. Sincere students cannot concentrate on their studies.
2. There are number of complaints about low internet speed in the computer Laboratory.
3. The students have suggested that there should be a separate canteen for the law college.
4. Gym facilities should be provided. Sport facility is minimal.
5. Although the students have drinking water facility on each floor of the college, some students were apprehensive about its cleanliness.

According to 86 per cent students, the concerned teachers covered the syllabus to the extent of 85 to 100 per cent and the material provided by them was adequate to understand the subject. For 56 per cent students, material for prescribed reading viz. books, reference books etc. was available easily whereas 40 per cent students get the said material with some difficulty.

As regards the preparation of the teachers, around 90 per cent students stated that teachers were preparing thoroughly and were able to communicate very effectively. The most of the teachers involved the students in group discussion and encouraged them to put forward their queries and difficulties etc. The advice provided by the teachers was found to be very helpful by around 75 per cent students. For 78 per cent students, overall teachers' approach was always courteous.

For around 76 per cent students, the fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers is fair. For 60 per cent students the institute takes active interest in promoting internship and field visits as well as the institute provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow. According to 74 per cent students the teachers inform them about their expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes.



According to 87 per cent students, they get regular assistance from the non-teaching and administrative staff of the College, whereas for 13 per cent students it was occasional.

As regards the last questions (General comments on infrastructure and other facilities provided by the college) most of the students were happy. However, few students were not happy and made critical comments. The summary of such comments is as under: -

1. Canteen, Library and Computer Laboratory facilities are not up to the satisfaction of student.
2. There are number of complaints about low internet speed in the computer Laboratory
3. According to some students, tuition fee as well as other fees should be accepted by the college by using digital modes.

REPORT ON THE FEED BACK FORM - 2021-2022

In order to get feedback response from the students about the various academic, co-curricular and other activities in the College, a well-structured feedback form was obtained from the students of the college. For the current academic year 2021-2022, the feedback forms were filled in by the students, before the examination. The analysis of the feedback forms is as under:

There were total nineteen questions in the feedback form. Out of 19 questions, the first 3 questions were related to the nature of syllabus, its adequacy or otherwise and how much syllabus was covered in the class. Eight questions (from question 4 to 12) dealt with the ability of teachers to teach, his preparation in the class room, role and approach of teacher in encouraging the students to learn, teaching-learning methods etc. Question no. 13 to 18 were about the mentoring process and assistance of the institution in multiple opportunities to learn and grow. Question No. 19 was regarding overall assistance received from the non-teaching or administrative staff of the College. The last 20<sup>th</sup> question was for the general comments of the students about the infrastructure provided by the college in terms of library, sports, canteen, and computer library etc.

About 81 per cent students found the syllabus adequate for each course. For 68 per cent students it was manageable and for 12 per cent it was easy to understand. About 9 per cent students found it challenging and 16 per cent found it slightly difficult. According to 80 per cent students, the concerned teachers covered the syllabus to the extent of 85 to 100 per cent and the material provided by them was adequate to understand the subject. For 62 per cent students, material for prescribed reading viz. books, reference books etc. was available easily whereas 35 per cent students get the said material with some difficulty.

As regards the preparation of the teachers, around 70 per cent students stated that teachers were preparing thoroughly and were able to communicate very effectively. The most of the teachers involved the students in group discussion and encouraged them to put forward their queries and difficulties etc. The advice provided by the teachers was found to be very helpful by around 69 per cent students. For 72 per cent students, overall teachers' approach was always courteous.

For around 76 per cent students, the fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers is fair. For 60 per cent students the institute takes active interest in promoting internship and field visits as well as the institute provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow. According to 74 per cent students the teachers inform them about their expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes.



According to 92 per cent students, they get regular assistance from the non-teaching and administrative staff of the college whereas for 5 per cent students it was occasional.

As regards the last questions (General comments on infrastructure and other facilities provided by the college) most of the students were happy. However, few students were not happy and made critical comments. The summary of such comments is as under: -

1. Few students complained about the lack of discipline in the library. According to them, there is too much noise in the library. Sincere students cannot concentrate on their studies.
2. The students have suggested that there should be a separate canteen for the law college.
3. Sport facility should be increased.
4. The library and computer laboratory timings should be increased.
5. Few students want that the classroom teaching should always be in English only.

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### INTRODUCTION

The college views its students as most important stakeholder and central to the very existence of the college. ## NATIONAL SEMINAR ON CONTEMPORARY CHALLENGES IN CONSUMER PROTECTION

2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2020

The College has organised two Day National Seminar on the topic "Contemporary Challenges in Consumer Protection" in Collaboration with the Center for Consumer Studies, Indian Institute of Public Administration, New Delhi. The Seminar was participated by 129 participants from various colleges. The Seminar was inaugurated by Hon. Prof. Dr. Suresh Misra, Center for Consumer Studies, IIPA, New Delhi. The seminar was aimed to empower the consumers is to educate them and make them aware about their rights and obligations.

The seminar consisted of Four Sessions bearing themes namely -

Session 1: Consumer Protection in E-banking

Session 2: RERA and Consumer Protection

Session 3 : Consumer Protection in E-Commerce

Session 4 : Puffed up, false and Misleading Advertisement and consumer Protection in this seminar total 10 resource persons delivered speech on the topic assigned

The discourse was summarized as under

### **1. Prof. Dr. Suresh Misra: Consumer Protection and Empowerment:**

Prof. Dr. Suresh Misra commented on issues of six consumer rights, knowledge and bargaining power of consumers. He explained in detail the outcome of study conducted by IPA with respect to consumer. That report was submitted to Standing Committee of Parliament. At the end speaker analysed various provisions of the Consumer Protection Act, 1986 and concluded that the Act is unable to protect consumers.

## **2. Ms. Kalvani Deshpande: Threats to the Rights of Consumers in E-banking and Regulatory Controls:**

Ms. Kalyani Deshpande highlighted the various threats in E-banking. She also highlighted the risks in using various applications used for E-banking. In a second part of the speech madam explained in brief the various laws regulating E-Banking, such as. The RBI Act 1934, the RBI Circulars the Information Technology Act 2000, the Consumer Protection Act, 1986 and also the Data Protection Bill 2016 Finally she concluded that unawareness amongst the consumers is the basic problem in E-banking.

## **3. Mr. S. B. Kulkarni : E-Banking - Advantages and Challenges:**

Mr. S. B. Kulkarni initially explained the advantages of digital payment and also disadvantages of paper money. Thereafter he also narrated precautions which should be taken by consumers while making digital payment through mobile applications. Finally he viewed that digital payment is useful to control black money, reduce cost of paper money and also to reduce smuggling activities.

## **4. Mr. Sumant Kolhe : Major Concerns of Consumers in Real Estate:**

Mr. Sumant Kolhe sir discussed the objects and historical background of the Real Estate (Regulation and Development) Act 2016. He explained in detail the various sections under RERA providing duties of builder in construction of building providing amenities, giving possession etc. Finally he concluded that the RERA is having deterrent provisions with respect to payment of compensation to purchaser and the penalties for offences. The object of these deterrent provisions is to protect the rights of consumers.

## **5. Mr. Ramesh Prabhu: An Overview of RERA:**

Mr. Ramesh Prabhu sir discussed the historical background of the Real Estate (Regulation and Development Act, 2016. He highlighted the importance and role of administrative and judicial authorities established under the Act.

Finally he concluded that speedy disposal and protection of rights of consumers is the prime purpose of those administrative and judicial authorities.

#### **6. Dr. Sapna Chadah: Consumer Law and Policy:**

Initially madam explained the importance of terms and conditions of E-Banking, categories of e-commerce, growth of e-commerce in India, the grievances in e-commerce, internet Threats, phishing and his with respect to fake websites.

Thereafter she discussed the various provisions under the Information Technology Act 2000, the Consumer Protection Act, 1986 and also the Consumer Protection Amendment Act, 2019 with respect to e-Commerce. She concluded by discussing the precautions which should be taken while making online transaction.

#### **7. Dr, Sanjay Kaptan: Various Facets of E-Commerce and Consumer Rights:**

Dr. Sanjay Kaptan sir discussed in detail the matters with respect to idea of consumer, value of money need to protect consumer, problems faced by consumer, ways used to exploit consumer, consumer rights and digital economy. He highlighted the importance of the Consumer Protection Amendment Act, 2019 to regulate e-commerce.

#### **8. Dr. Atul Deshpande: Consumer Protection and E-Commerce – Issues:**

Dr. Atul Deshpande sir spoke on economical aspects of the topic given, needs of consumer. Need of consumer protection, grievances of consumer, deficiencies in services, and legal framework with respect to consumer protection with respect to e-commerce.

#### **9. Dr. G. B. Roddy : Puffed up, Misleading Advertisements and Consumer**

Dr. G. B. Reddy s spoke on various aspects of the topic, such as, kinds of advertisement, exaggerated advertisements, and persuasions in advertisements with some examples. He also explained New laws with

respect to advertisement, regulatory authorities, remedies available to consumer and also judicial approach towards the misleading advertisements.

#### **10. Adv. Dr. Uday Warunjikar: Misleading Advertisements and Consumer:**

Adv. Dr. Uday Warunkar sir highlighted the practical approach towards the misleading advertisements. He gave some examples of laws prohibiting advertisement in few professions He also highlighted the impact of misleading advertisements and remedies thereon. He finally concluded that there is need of exclusive law for regulating advertisement.

Every session was followed by questions and answers. The participants have shown a great interest by asking many good questions. In this national seminar total 14 Papers were presented.

These are the major issues raised and discussed by the Resource Persons, paper presenters and participants. The above important suggestions came out of deliberations and discussions of the seminar.

Students of Yashwantrao Chavan Law college have been given training under our campaign programme to improve the standard of living of the beggars by doing counselling.

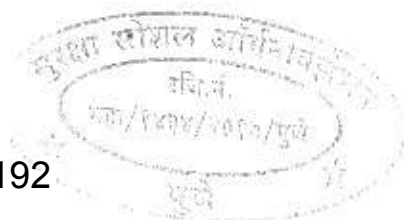

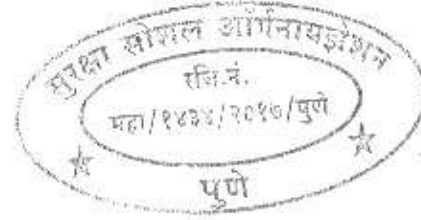

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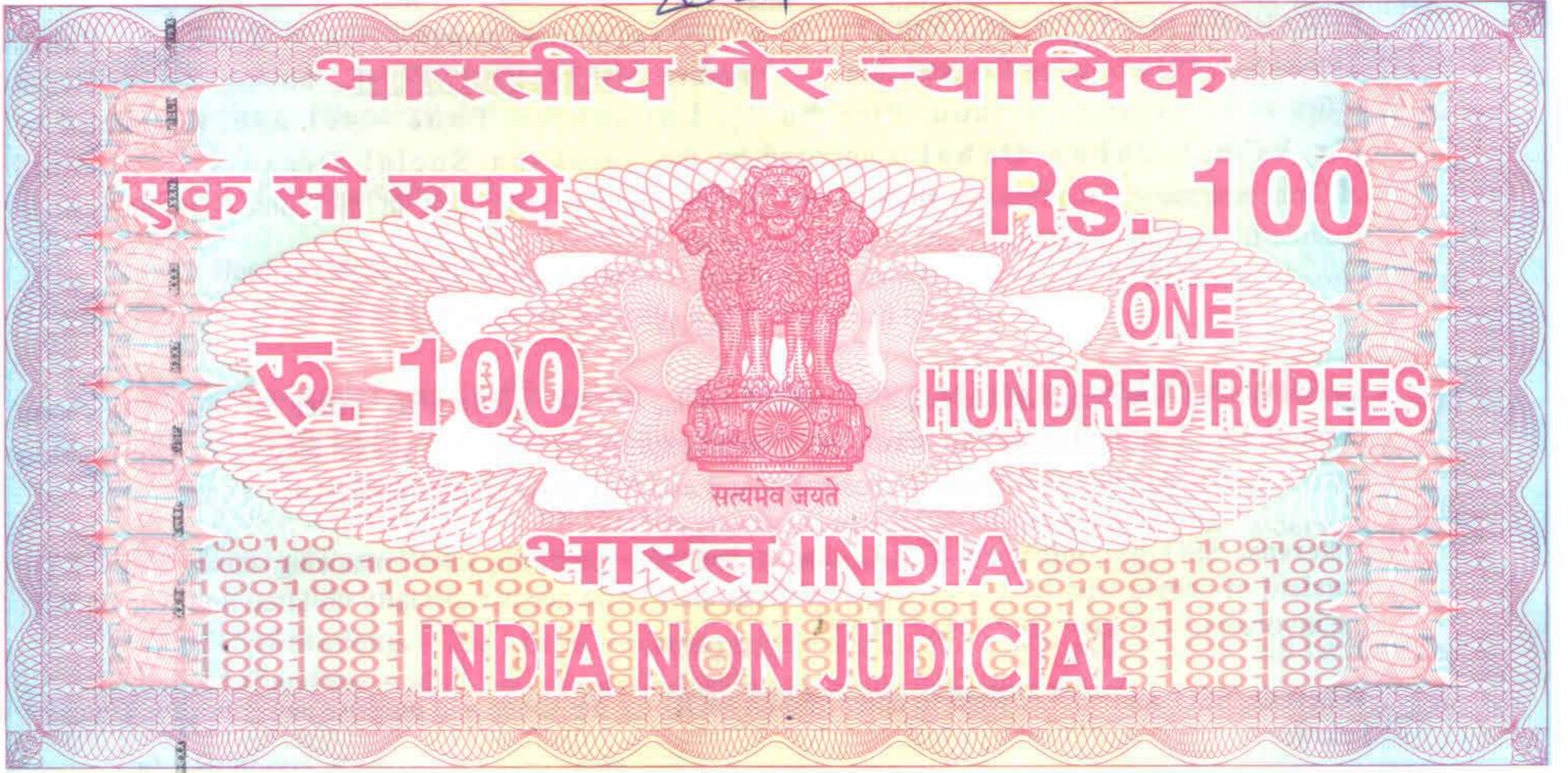

**1. Purpose, Scope of the MOU:**

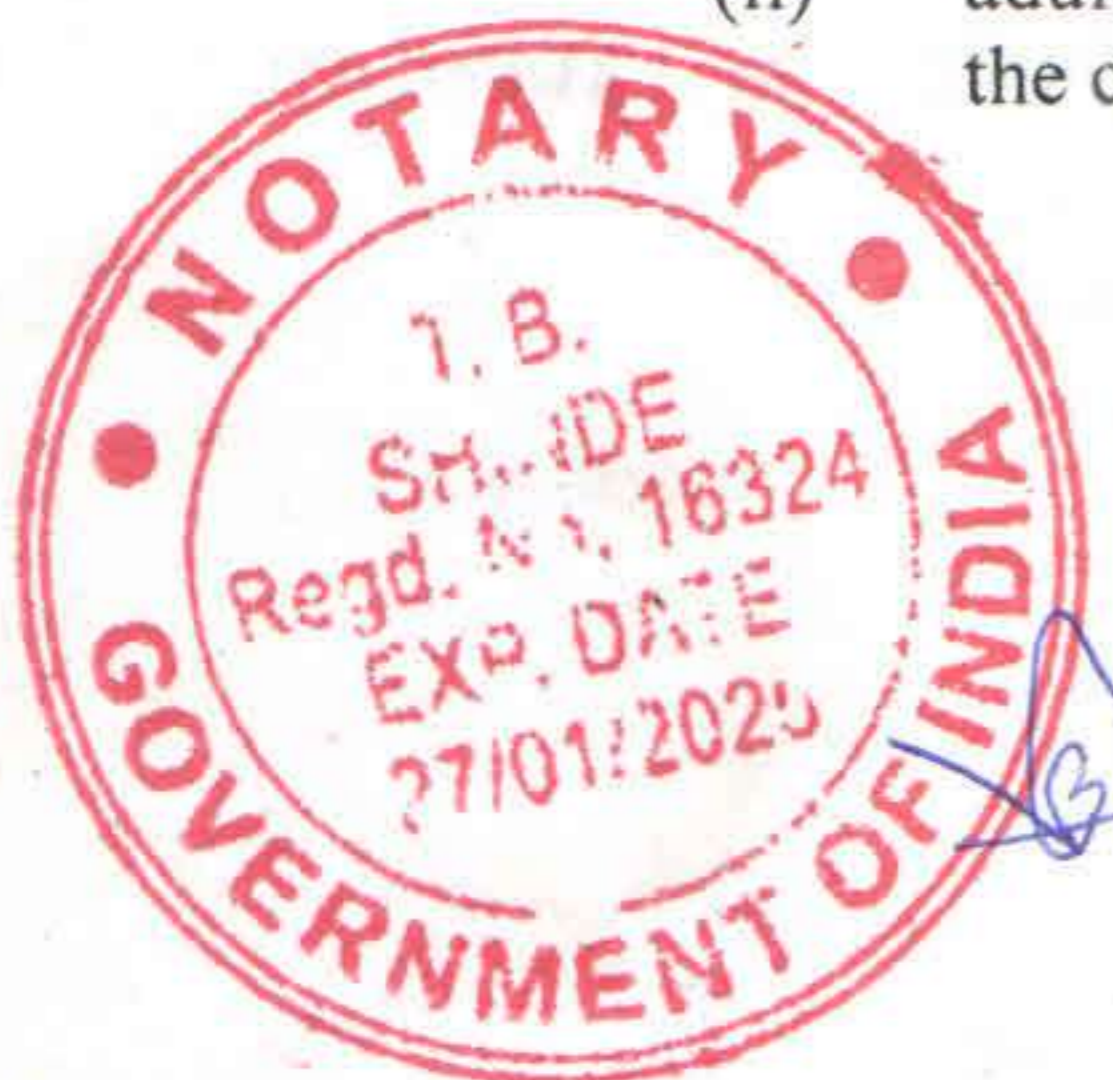

## 2. Roles & Responsibilities of SSO

- e) **Reports:** Reports of every campaign and programmes will be prepared by the students and SSO and will be submitted to YCLC.
- f) **Duration :** The programmes will have 45 days trainings and on field campaign activities in an academic year.
- g) **Transportation/Meal:** SSO hereby takes the responsibility to make the expenses for travelling and Meal of the students for such programmes.
- h) **Certification:** Both SSO and YCLC have agreed to prepare the Certificate of Participation of students and will be given to the students on completion of such Internship Programmes.

**3. Project Duration:** This MOU will be effective for the three academic years (from 2020-2021 to 2022-2023) and will be implemented in 3 phases.

**4. Termination:** Either party may terminate this MOU at the end of any academic year by mutual written consent by giving 3 months notice to the other party.

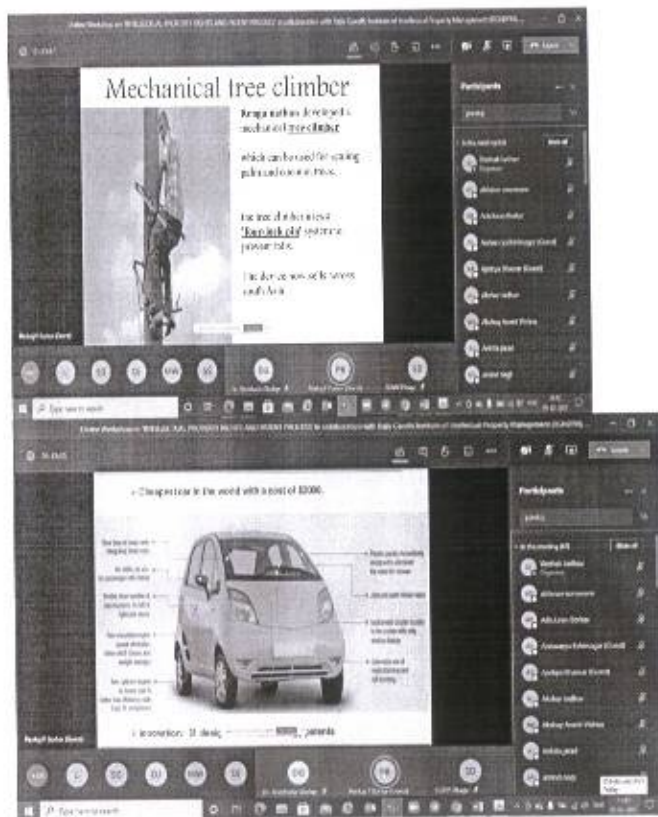

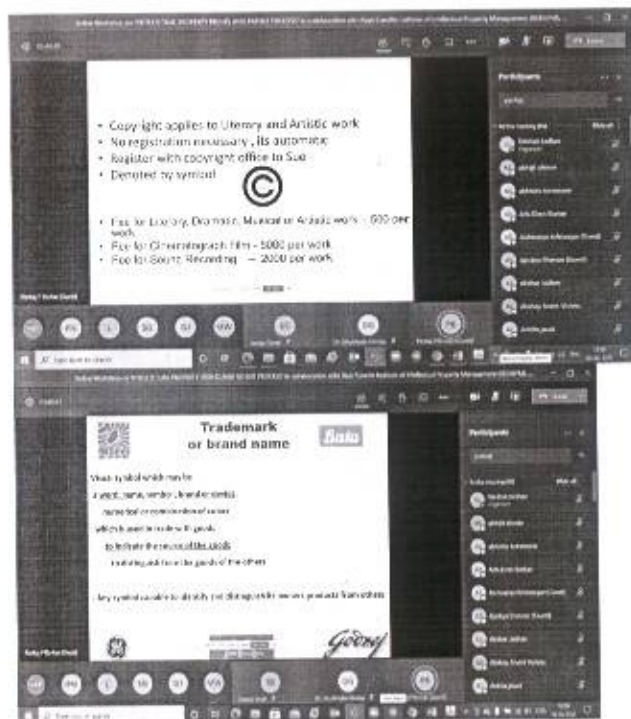

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WHEREAS ASCL has expertise in providing education, training and consultancy in the field of cyber law;  
AND WHEREAS YCLC is desirous of providing a quality course named **Diploma in Cyber Law**;

#### A. Interpretations

Reference to this **MOU** or any other instrument is a reference to this **MOU** or that other instrument as amended, varied, novated or substituted from time to time.

Reference to recitals, clauses, schedules and appendices are references to recitals, clauses, schedules and appendices of and to this **MOU**.

Reference to any statute or statutory provision includes a reference to that statutory provision as from time to time amended, extended, or re-enacted.

Words importing the singular number shall include the plural and vice versa, and words importing the masculine gender shall include the feminine and neuter gender and vice versa, and words importing persons shall include firms, institutions, trusts, societies, associations of persons, companies and bodies corporate and unincorporated, registered and unregistered.

#### B. Terms of MOU

This MOU embodies the following terms:

##### I. Name of course and certification

1. ASCL shall jointly conduct the course titled **Diploma in Cyber Law** (hereinafter referred to as DCL) in association with YCLC in online mode.
2. Upon successful completion of the said course, students shall receive certificate for the same issued jointly by YCLC and ASCL.

##### II. Sale and Distribution of the prospectus and application forms

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*Gharap*

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1. The distribution of application forms to prospective students of DCL shall be undertaken by YCLC.

All expenses relating to the design and printing of the said application forms shall be borne by ASCL.

### III. Eligibility for the course

1. The eligibility for the course in the online mode will be 10+2 with a minimum of 40%. YCLC will conduct the admission process and the same will be given on merit basis.

### IV. Collection and distribution of Course Fees

1. The fees for the DCL and the fee sharing between YCLC and ASCL shall be as per **Annexure – II** attached to this MOU.
2. The collection of fees from students will be done by YCLC.
3. ASCL's share (As per Annexure II) of the said fee shall be paid to ASCL by YCLC by way of cheque in favour of "Asian School of Cyber Laws" as per the following schedule:
  - a. 100% of the total amount of ASCL's share will be payable by YCLC within 20 days of the commencement of the course.

### V. Schedule of Course

1. Each batch of DCL in the *online mode* shall begin in the month of August / September and shall be of 6 months' duration. The exact date of commencement shall be mutually agreed upon by the YCLC and ASCL.
2. The Online examination for DCL in online mode shall be held in the month of February / March the following year.

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3. The results for DCL shall be declared within 30 days of the said examinations.
4. The dates of commencement of the Diploma, assessments and declaration of results for each batch are, however, subject to revision after mutual consent by both parties.

#### VI. Course material

ASCL shall provide online digital learning material to the students enrolled for DCL. All expenses relating to the preparation, updation, and online access of the said material shall be borne by ASCL. The Syllabus of DCL is hereby attached as **Annexure – I** to this MOU.

1. ASCL shall also provide supplementary video content in addition to the aforementioned Diploma material to facilitate holistic learning of the subject.
2. The students will be given access to ASCL ONE (ASCL's Online Education Platform).

#### VII. Classes

1. ASCL shall conduct 2 online query resolution classes per batch. The exact schedule of query resolution classes for the online course shall be finalized by YCLC and ASCL after considering the convenience of students enrolled for DCL.
2. Students will be expected to send in their queries online in advance. The query resolution classes will be conducted only subject to students submitting their queries in advance (as per schedule decided by YCLC and ASCL).
3. ASCL shall provide the online platform for conducting the classes. The students will be expected to use their mobile devices to access the class online.
  - a. The technical support for this platform will be provided by ASCL.

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4. ASCL shall provide expert faculty for conducting the classes of DCL in online mode. All expenses relating to the fee payable to the faculty and traveling incurred by the faculty for conducting the said classes, if any shall be borne by ASCL.

**VIII. Assessment Procedure and Certification**

1. The assessment for DCL shall consist of one online examination of two hours and 100 marks.
2. ASCL will be responsible for assessment and it may change the assessment pattern as stated above from time to time if required.
3. ASCL shall be responsible for preparing the assessment questions for DCL and shall provide the online question paper for the said assessment.
4. The students may give the exam from any convenient location, which has a stable Internet and Electricity connection.
5. ASCL shall provide the online portal, which the students will be able to access to appear for the examination.
6. A student of DCL, who has been unsuccessful in securing a minimum of 40/100 in the online the examination or has not been able to appear for the examination (for any reason), will be allowed to sit for re-examination only on the payment of a re-exam fee of Rs.1000/- that will be retained by ASCL.
7. The date of re-examination for DCL will be mutually decided by and ASCL.
8. ASCL and YCLC shall jointly grant the certificate to successful students.
9. ASCL shall arrange for certification of successful students of each batch at its own expense and shall courier the certificates to the official address of YCLC. YCLC shall be responsible for distributing the certificates to the successful students.

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**IX. Cancellation / Ratification**

1. This MOU shall initially be in force for a period of one year, and may thereafter be renewed for such period and on such terms as may be mutually agreed.
2. Either party to this MOU is at liberty to terminate and / or ratify and / or cancel this MOU by giving a prior notice of at least three months.
3. In the event of termination of this MOU before the completion of a batch, both parties shall ensure the successful completion of the course by the said batch.

**C. Miscellaneous provisions**

**1. Force Majeure**

If a party is prevented from or delayed in carrying out any provision of this MOU by reason of **Force Majeure**, as defined in the definition clause, the party whose performance is so prevented or delayed, upon prompt notice to the other party, shall be excused from such performance, to the extent and during the period of such prevention or delay.

**2. Governing Law**

This MOU will be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of India.

**3. Arbitration**

In case of any dispute etc. both parties agree to attempt arbitration using an independent arbitrator. The decision of such independent arbitrator shall prevail and will be binding on both parties.

The provisions of this clause shall survive the termination of the MOU.

**4. Assignment**

Neither party shall assign this MOU to a third party without the prior written / electronic consent of the other party.

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**5. Variation and Waiver**

No variation of any of the terms of the MOU shall be binding unless confirmed in writing or through electronic mail and no failure, delay, relaxation or forbearance on the part of either party in exercising any power or right under this MOU shall operate as a waiver of such power or right.

Failure of a Party to insist upon strict and punctual performance of any provision hereof shall neither constitute a waiver of, or estoppel against asserting, the right to require such performance, nor shall such failure in one case constitute a waiver or estoppel with respect to a later case.

**6. Entirety**

This MOU is the entire MOU recording the broad understanding between the Parties. Each Party represents that in entering into this MOU it does not rely on any previous representations, whether express or implied, or on any prior inducement or MOU of any kind or nature. All prior negotiations, representations, letters of intent or MOUs concerning the subject matter of this MOU are hereby deemed cancelled.

**7. Relationship**

Nothing herein shall be deemed to constitute the Parties, or any of them, as partners, association, agent of each other nor shall anything contained herein deem to confer on any Party any authority to incur any obligations or liability on behalf of the other Party nor shall have the power to obligate or bind the other in any way whatsoever, except as provided herein.

**8. Miscellaneous**

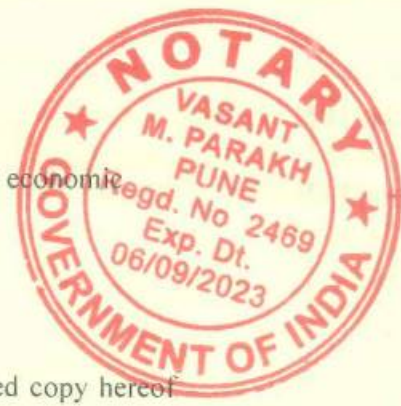
This MOU shall be interpreted, having regard to its underlying business purposes, in a reasonable and commercial manner rather than in strict accordance with the literal meaning of the language used.

Ms. Gole has stated that the real crux of the problem is child sex ratio in 0-6 year's age group. Study of this ratio helps us to understand whether



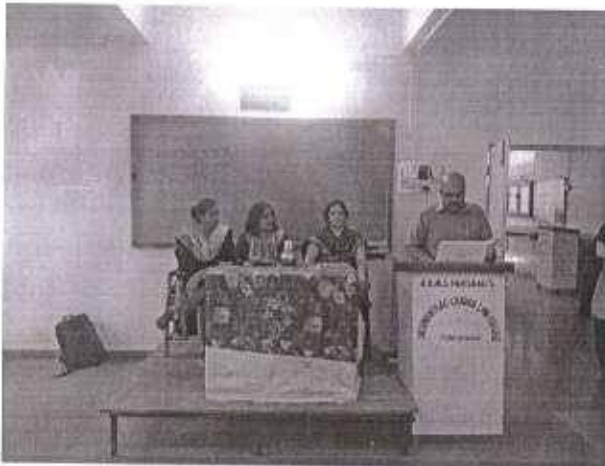

determination from technological development in medical field which makes Human interference very easy.

Ms. Deepa Tak stated that there is difference between sex determination and abortion. The concentration of the government policies, NGO and media is on the abortion and not on sex determination which lies in patriarchal nature of Indian Society.



Prof. Madhuri Shirlekar narrated the legal provisions relating to women. She further explained the necessity of strengthening the provisions of the existing law to make it more potent and effective.

The programme consisted of lectures, film show and open discussion on the issue which is related to the gender deficit in India. At the end feedback was taken.
